Grants, Fellowships & Awards

Membership in the CES Academic Consortium provides affiliated faculty and students with access to an array of grants, fellowships and awards. For example, this year the Council will award over 20 Pre-dissertation Research Fellowships to promising graduate students working in European Studies. Each fellowship is valued at over \$6000 or thirteen times the cost of a year's membership in the Consortium. Other members-only grant and award programs include the Council's Book Award Competition, First Article Prizes, and research travel grants.

And the number of members-only programs is constantly expanding. Indeed, plans are currently in the works to provide greater support for undergraduate education and advanced language study, meaning that the rewards of Consortium membership will soon get even better.

Conferences & Publications

Consortium members provide financial support for many Council programs, reducing costs for affiliated libraries, faculty, and students. Need an example? Take a look at the latest issue of the Council's semi-annual journal, *Perspectives on Europe*. In this age of sky-high journal subscription rates, *Perspectives on Europe* costs only \$40 a year while featuring some of today's most insightful and accessible interdisciplinary research on European Studies. Consortium institutions also make it possible for the Council to provide conference travel grants and to keep registration and general membership fees low. By pooling member dues, we return better value and a wider range of programming for faculty and students at Consortium institutions.
